The Knoxbrooke name itself, comes from the blending of Shire of Knox and Shire of Sherbrooke and was the first disability service for the region.

From our humble beginnings accompanied by a great vision, we now support people living with a disability, not only in Knox City Council and Shire of Yarra Ranges but also Maroondah, Whitehorse, Monash, Cardinia and Baw Baw. When Knoxbrooke's Rotarian founders returned to Knoxbrooke's Golden Jubilee in 2017, they were so pleasantly surprised to see what Knoxbrooke had become during its 50 year journey.

Being a charity, we are always thankful for donations as they enable us to better support people with disabilities experiencing disadvantage. All donations to Knoxbrooke are tax-deductible and can be made at any time. Occasionally, Knoxbrooke receives a bequest through a persons will. I'm really excited to be seconded from the Finance team to the role of Interim General Manager at YVBLF and to work with the team across our three nursery sites. Thanks to the leadership team and everyone at YVBLF for making me feel welcome!



It's been a difficult winter with Covid, colds and flu impacting so many — thankfully everyone has recovered well. It's great to see everyone work together to cover any absences and keep our workplace safe.

Yarra View & Bushland Flora Nurseries

While the weather has been cold some spring growth is now starting to appear on a few plant varieties. It's a reminder that the busy production season is almost here.

Potting commenced at York Road a couple of weeks ago and the site is now starting to fill with recently potted stock and some fantastic 14cm/20cm stock transferred from Wandin. Some amazing tube stock produced at Clegg Road is currently being transferred to Wandin (and York Road) where potting will start this week. Our sites will soon be full and our attention will turn to maintaining the plants in preparation for a busy sales period.





Some York Road supported employees are currently trialling work at Clegg Road. This is a great opportunity to meet new people and further develop their nursery skills in a new environment. We also had eight supported employees recently complete their Certificate III in Horticulture at Box Hill Tafe — a fantastic achievement!

We have just completed deliveries for the Hallam and Glenroy commercial projects and supply for some of our schools' projects will commence in October. We are currently in negotiations regarding Mont Albert Level Crossing and there is a constant stream of quotes being prepared by our commercial team including the Pakenham Station upgrade. This is being done by YVBLF as the head contractor in a Nursery Co-Op group of social enterprises and, if successful, around \$500K would be grown and supplied by YVBLF.

Our SES team has grown with the addition of two new members – Leah Rowe (Training, Support and Administration Officer) and Jimmy Baysinger (Training and Support Officer). Please join me in welcoming Leah and Jimmy to the team.

Yarra View Garden Centre

The Garden Centre continues to evolve with a new layout and ongoing refinement of the product range. Sales continue to grow, even through periods which are typically considered quieter.

In late July the Garden Centre was awarded \$50K of vouchers as part of a community engagement program for schools impacted by construction of the North East Link. A number of schools have been given \$2K vouchers to spend between now and the end of 2023.

A ten day sale tied to "National Tree Day" was run and generated a significant amount of sales in July/August – another great initiative from the Garden Centre team!



Knoxbrooke Outsource

Outsource have been busy keeping up with kindling orders as everyone shivers through another cold and long winter. We continue to undertake our regular packing jobs for Dollar Sweets, Uni Pro and Telegram and just picked up a new job from a company called AGS where we are filling and making grow bags.

There are many opportunities for new business so exciting times are ahead. Thanks to the Outsource team for all their hard work.

Jigsaw/Waratah

Jigsaw and Waratah are experiencing a significant amount of change with our Operations Team

Leader, Darren Kleeven, in full swing looking at staffing hours, OH&S and sourcing new opportunities.

Similar to Outsource, a cold and long winter has seen strong kindling sales over the last couple of months which is keeping the production team very busy. We have welcomed two supported employees to our team and we're excited to have them on board.





Even through the cold winter months Knoxbrooke 365 support staff have been assisting our wonderful clients with transport, in-home support and community access for recreation and leisure activities. The list of community access activities our 365 clients can undertake is endless, we tailor support to what each client requires and assist them to work towards achieving their individual NDIS goals.

365 clients in Outer East and West Gippsland have been undertaking a large range of activities in the community from attending zoos, swimming pools, sporting pursuits and events, discos, fishing, craft groups, karaoke, movies, gaming, bowling leagues and so much more. 365 staff have also supported clients to attend appointments with specialists and helped clients follow OT guidelines when doing hydrotherapy, pet therapy and gym sessions.





In-home support has focused on cooking, budgeting, safe handling of food, household chores and companionship. 365 have been supporting clients on weekends away and with sleepover shifts in client's homes when families have gone away. We currently have 365 staff supporting a client for the next 3 weeks for an excursion in Tamworth. 365 staff have been supporting students at Knoxbrooke Achieve and on work placements. Recently we have also assisted a 365 client find and move into new accommodation.

365 staff have been supporting the Extras Group with activities on Friday evenings going out for dinner and on Saturdays with activities such as mini golf, movies, bowling, Melbourne Aquarium, Melbourne Art Gallery and going to the snow at Mt Donna Buang.

success with more donations than we can sort. We have extended trading hours to include Saturday and an extra donation bin to help with demand.


Our Supported employees are kicking goals and doing a brilliant job, helping out with sorting, registers, and general customer service.

Support Option Meetings

A goal for Knoxbrooke is to drive for continuous improvement and within the Support Options team it has been identified that more often than not we were having discussions in relation to clients support needs with families, carers and support coordinators in the first instance rather than our clients. addressed this limitation to our service by implementing face-to-face support option meetings prior to preparing NDIS plan review proposals. This shift addresses the NDIS Quality and Safeguarding Commission requirements in relation to client's choice and control "Communication with each participant about the provision of supports is responsive to their needs and is provided in the language, mode of communication and terms that the participant is most likely to understand.

The benefits of the face-to-face meetings are already having an impact, it has increased the clients rapport and trust in the support option advisors, clients are more comfortable asking questions face to face and are developing an increased knowledge about the NDIS and it's intent to provide them with the support they need, not just in employment or day services but in life.

Group Social Events

The fear of socialising created by the Covid pandemic is slowly dissipating and we have found that our clients are craving group social interaction. Knoxbrooke are addressing this demand across the board through Extra's for Outer East Supported Employees, Achieve Plus for current and graduated Achieve clients and MSN Extras for our West Gippsland clients. All events are in high demand and the NDIS team are arranging additional service agreements ensuring that NDIS plans will fund the support.


